SECURITY

The security of your children is very important to us. All of our workers have passed background checks and should always be wearing a shirt identifying which club they are working in. Feel free to question or bring to our attention anyone who is not properly identified. We welcome you to visit club at any time. However if you desire to stay on a recurring basis, please wait in the foyer upstairs. This is essential for security reasons, because we cannot have anyone staying in the rooms who has not been properly approved to work in Awana. It can also be disruptive to the flow of the evening. If you do wait in the foyer, please have consideration for the Prayer Meeting nearby. Otherwise, we would love for you to take advantage of the Ladies Bible Study or Prayer Meeting.

A child must be dropped off and picked up by a parent or approved adult (over 18) at their room - If you have made arrangements to have someone other than yourself pick up your child, please send a written note directing who is allowed to pick up your child. Cubbies must be signed in and out of their room. Please pick up your child no later than 7:05 pm.

Parents—How You Can Help!

Moms and dads—You are important in helping your child enjoy the Awana program. Here are a few of our suggestions:

- Help your child to attend Awana every week. Faithful attendance helps to build friendships and enables the clubber to achieve awards.
- Make sure your child wears their Awana uniform and proper shoes each week.
- Be sure they arrive on time Awana starts promptly at 5:20. Please do not drop your child off before 5:10 pm.
- Encourage your child to learn the Bible verses during the week at home. If they learn consistently each week, they will be able to finish the book by the end of the year to earn their Book Award!
- If your child has a learning/memorization challenge, please let us know as soon as possible. We will try to find someone to work with them individually.
- When you come to pick up your clubber at the end of the evening, please come inside to get your children. We will not allow the clubbers to leave their rooms without a Parent / Adult.
- Please pick up your Clubber no later than 7:05 pm.
- Make sure to have a Permission form filled out for your child. This form must be filled out by the Parent / Guardian in order for a child to play games (after his/her 1st week).

What is Awana?

Awana was officially started in 1950 by Art Rorheim in Chicago, IL. The name Awana stands for "Approved Workmen Are Not Ashamed," from 2 Timothy 2:15 – "Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a workman who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the Word of Truth." Awana's goal is to reach boys and girls with the Gospel of Christ and to train them to serve Him.

The Awana Club night is divided into three parts:

Game Time promotes cooperation, working as a team, and having fun. *Handbook Time* is for reciting, discussing, and understanding Bible verses. *Council Time* is a time of learning how to apply God's Word to real life through creative teaching, special themes, and a variety of activities.

OUR GAME LEADERS WOULD LIKE YOU TO KNOW:

- Game Time is a very active time which includes running, jumping, bending over, etc. Please dress your child appropriately for these activities. **GYM SHOES ARE A MUST FOR SAFETY REASONS.**
- Do not bring balls/toys with you from home.
- Do not play with the game equipment until instructed by the Game Leaders.
- Go directly to your color line.
- Line up tallest to shortest and be ready to listen (Leaders will be there to help).
- Be considerate of others and their belongings.

CLUB RULES

In order to have a safe, enjoyable, and orderly environment for all the children, our Awana Club has established some rules. Our leaders will enforce these rules, and it would be very helpful to us if you would remind your clubber that we expect them to be followed.

- 1. Respect and obey your leaders and other staff members.
- 2. Take part in the entire club program unless you brought a note from your parents or you are excused by your club director.
- 3. Walk at all times (except during games).
- 4. Remain with your leader at all times during club.
- 5. Remain in the church building at all times.
- 6. For fun and for your safety, **you must wear or bring proper shoes for Game Time.** No flip flops or shoes that come off easily.
- 7. No use of foul language or gestures. Also no kicking, hitting, tripping, rough-housing, fighting, etc.
- 8. If you disobey the rules, we will enforce a 3 Strike Procedure.
 - a. Strike 1: Verbal warning
 - b. **Strike 2:** the clubber will be removed to a "timeout" location in the immediate area or at the Secretary Table.
 - c. **Strike 3:** The clubber will be taken to the Commander. Parents will be called immediately, and the child will be sent home.

Each Wednesday the child starts with a clean slate, but if the three strike cycle is repeated again within 1 month, the clubber will have to miss the next week of club.

WE ALSO ASK THAT CLUBBERS:

- Do not bring toys unless it is a special night. If a younger child needs something for comfort, please ensure it stays in their bag and clear it with the Director first.
- Do not throw snowballs in the winter.

Awana is meant to be fun for everyone! Please let us know if there is a problem.

Bring a Friend Alternate Activity

Why: Learn about God, memorize Bible verses, play games, make friends Show your completed cards to your leader **before** you give them to your friends. This will take you at least 2 weeks—showing your cards to your leader the first week and showing them the names of the kids you gave them to the following week.
